The topic of our **January, 2010** General meeting is “**Making Family History Movies**” with iMovie and Final Cut Express. The presenter is **Ed Mason**, a co-founder of MacGen. iMovie and Final Cut Express programs only work on Mac Computers.

Ed Mason has given MacIntosh Movie-making presentations in the past, most recently at the “Finding Your Roots” Conference in Concord, last October. He will go through the process of shooting the movie, creating titles, matching music or speaking to the video and using features of both iMovie (that comes free with your Macintosh) and Final Cut Express, an inexpensive movie editing program.

We will also have our 2nd Wednesday Workshop, 10 days earlier to follow up on previous presentations and general Q and A.

shortly. She is a very knowledgeable and entertaining speaker

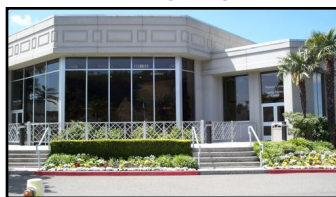
March 2010 - Rich Peterson will show us how to produce family history slide shows with iPhoto and other software.
